

The Ngee Ann Kongsi Gifts \$13.5 million to Ngee Ann Polytechnic

Enduring partnership will enhance student aid and enrich the polytechnic's student development programmes

Singapore, 02 October 2025 — Philanthropic organisation The Ngee Ann Kongsi donated \$13.5 million to Ngee Ann Polytechnic (NP) yesterday, in the presence of Ms Jasmin Lau, Minister of State for Education, and Digital Development and Information. The donation from The Ngee Ann Kongsi will be used for supporting bursaries, scholarships, student aid grants, NP's education fund, as well as its operations.

The contribution will also bolster NP's suite of student development initiatives, including the institution's flagship Global Entrepreneurial Internship Programme (GEIP) and Overseas Merit Fellowship (OMF).

Launched in 2016, the GEIP was the first programme of its kind for polytechnic students to immerse in vibrant start-up ecosystems across Southeast Asia. Over six months, participants gain hands-on experience in start-ups, receive mentorship from seasoned entrepreneurs, and take part in learning journeys and pitch challenges. To date, more than 850 NP students have benefitted from the GEIP, thanks to The Ngee Ann Kongsi's generous donation which supports part of the programme costs.

Official Open

One of the beneficiaries of GEIP is recent Business Studies graduate Teoh Yi Wen, who was also awarded the Ngee Ann Kongsi Gold Medal this year. She shared: "Through GEIP, I experienced firsthand the challenges and rewards of working in the dynamic Vietnamese environment. I learnt to navigate cultural differences and adapt quickly, and gained new perspectives on global business operations. My time in Ho Chi Minh City has spurred me to pursue entrepreneurship in the environment-tech start-up space, where I hope to create innovative, sustainable solutions that can make a real difference in the world."

Inspired by stories like Yi Wen's, there is growing interest for global exposure among students. To cater to this, NP will create opportunities for more than 3,000 students to gain overseas learning experiences this academic year, up from 2,000 last year. Additionally, over 200 students are set to participate in overseas internships, including the GEIP.

"We are deeply grateful for the continued generosity of The Ngee Ann Kongsi. This significant donation allows us to provide more of our students with invaluable opportunities to gain global perspectives and develop into confident, well-rounded individuals. The funds will go a long way in supporting programmes that are crucial for nurturing a generation of leaders ready to make meaningful impact in today's interconnected and rapidly evolving landscape," said Mr Lim Kok Kiang, Principal & CEO of Ngee Ann Polytechnic.
