

# **Understanding Chinese Language & Culture**

As the only course of its kind offered at the polytechnic level and with at least half of it conducted in Chinese, CHS sharpens your language skills while preparing you for careers in the education, marketing and advertising, tourism, and business sectors. You will go on field trips to a wide variety of organisations that reach out to Mandarin-speaking communities to broaden your perspective of Chinese culture and society.

In the first year of study, you will uncover the different facets of Chinese history, culture and literature. You will also learn to use digitalised translation tools effectively and to present, write and speak with proficient Chinese communication skills.

This course is conducted by the National Institute of Early Childhood Development (NIEC) in collaboration with NP at the NIEC (NP) campus.
