Shantini D/O Subramaniam

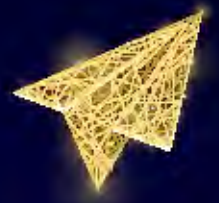

Outstanding Arts Award (Team)

NP Percussion (Baracuda Batucada)



NP Percussion, known as Baracuda Batucada, is a vibrant force in Ngee Ann Polytechnic's arts scene, electrifying audiences with their dynamic percussion performances. In 2024, their standout appearances included the Singapore Night Festival (SNF)—collaborating with SMU's Samba Masala—World Drum Night, and the Reflection Arts Festival @ RP, where they captivated crowds and sold out over 1,000 tickets at World Drum Night alone.

Dedicated to fostering musical passion, NP Percussion conducts workshops and try-outs including a special session at the Youth Leadership Camp. Their collaborative spirit is evident in their support for other CCAs and community engagements, solidifying their role in NP's artistic community.

Outstanding Club, Society, or Interest Group Award

NP Peer Helpers



NP Peer Helpers has been a leading force in championing mental wellness at Ngee Ann Polytechnic. Through monthly sharing sessions and meaningful events, Peer Helpers has created a safe and supportive environment for students to grow, connect, and seek help when needed. A standout initiative in 2024 was the Artful Connection Symposium, the first large-scale collaboration between the main Peer Helpers and satellite teams across academic schools, alongside Final Year Project teams supported by Solace Art Psychotherapy and Limitless. The event featured

art therapy activities that encouraged self-expression and promoted emotional well-being.

Peer Helpers also made their mark beyond campus, representing NP at the Youth Mental Health Symposium and Mental Health Film Festival. Through peer support, creative wellness programs, and partnerships with external mental health organizations, NP Peer Helpers continue to raise awareness and empower the NP community to prioritise mental health and self-care.

Outstanding Community Service Award (Individual)

Clare's unwavering dedication to community service has deeply impacted Jurong's residents and families, fostering inclusivity and social well-being. As a Residential Network Grassroots Volunteer, she helped organize the 2025 Chinese New Year Celebration, uniting over 1,100 residents across diverse backgrounds and strengthening community bonds. Leading initiatives such as "Share A Gift, Warm A Heart" under the Jurong Spring Youth Network, Clare supported over 150 low-income families, providing essential aid and meaningful experiences for children. Her role as a Silver Generation Ambassador and Meals-On-Wheels volunteer highlights her commitment to empowering and caring for the elderly, ensuring their voices are heard and needs met.

As Regional Leader of Happy Children Happy Future, Clare offers free tuition and mentorship to underprivileged children, empowering their academic and personal growth. Her contributions as a Case Writer for Meet-The-People Sessions and leadership in academic mentoring further demonstrate her empathy, resilience, and drive to create lasting positive change. Clare's exceptional character, balanced leadership, and genuine compassion make her an inspiring role model in both school and society.

Outstanding Community Service Award (Team)

Food Aid Club



FoodAID Club has been a driving force in addressing food insecurity across Singapore. In 2024 alone, the club organised over 30 community service events, regularly mobilising volunteers across key areas such as Jurong West, Toa Payoh, and Tampines. These efforts have brought direct support to vulnerable individuals and families, building stronger, more compassionate communities.

With each event engaging 15 to 20 volunteers, the club has rallied over 400 unique volunteers—fostering a spirit of generosity and civic responsibility within Ngee Ann Polytechnic. Through consistent acts of kindness, the FoodAID Club exemplifies how collective action can create sustainable and meaningful change.

Outstanding Environmental Award (Individual)

Yu Ruoxi



Ruoxi is a passionate sustainability advocate whose leadership and action have left a lasting mark across multiple environmental initiatives. Volunteering with organizations like Tzu Chi Foundation, Nature Kakis, and Ground-Up Initiative (GUI), she has combined advocacy with impact. At Tzu Chi Foundation, she championed eco-education through Eco Youth Days, influencing sustainable habits in local and international visitors. With Nature Kakis, Ruoxi helped bring Singapore's "City in Nature" vision to life by curating biodiversity experiences and co-leading the Nature Kakis Learning Festival 2025. At GUI, she led sustainable farming efforts, from creative composting projects to resourceful fundraising for their relocation.

Within Ngee Ann Polytechnic, Ruoxi serves as Vice-President of the Environmental Rangers Club, further driving student involvement in sustainability. Her efforts have also earned her a nomination for the HSBC-NYAA Youth Environmental Award, recognizing her as a rising changemaker.

Outstanding Environmental Award (Team)

Environmental Rangers Club



The Environmental Rangers Club (ERC) has demonstrated strong environmental leadership through sustained action and education. In 2024, ERC actively participated in a wide range of eco-focused events and initiatives, both on and off campus. Notably, they took part in MOE's "Adopt A Block" sustainability initiative, conducting workshops and door-to-door engagements at Marine Terrace. In partnership with Goodlife Makan (Montfort Care), ERC created outreach materials and led monthly sessions on water and energy conservation, recycling, and greening efforts - receiving positive feedback for their engaging and meaningful content.

On campus, ERC continued to champion green living by organizing workshops on recycling, composting, and upcycling for the NP community. As part of NP's sustainability committee, they played an active role in tackling campus waste, developing educational campaigns and rallying peers to take action. Through passionate advocacy and creative education, ERC empowers students and residents alike to build a more sustainable future.

Outstanding Enterprise Award (Individual)

Lingesh S/O Sachuvarantham



Kloss Solutions, co-founded by Lingesh (Ngee Ann Polytechnic) and Javen (Singapore Polytechnic), is a shining example of student-led innovation with purpose. Their flagship product, the Reusable Dental Flosser (RDF), emerged in 2022 and won second prize at the School Sustainability Challenge by Junior Achievement Singapore - kickstarting the business with a \$3,000 prize and a \$220 3D printer. Kloss tackles the environmental impact of single-use flossers by offering a sustainable, cost-effective, and user-friendly alternative. With the potential to reduce plastic waste in dental hygiene by up to 98%, Kloss stands out in a market ripe for disruption.

In May 2024, Kloss received trademark approval, with a provisional patent in progress - reinforcing its growing commercial presence. Beyond product development, the team works with local dentists and schools to raise awareness about flossing habits, oral health, and long-term cost savings, impacting over 2,000 individuals directly. With a strong four-digit revenue and a powerful mission, Kloss Solutions is more than a startup - it's a movement toward greener, smarter everyday living.

Outstanding Innovation Award (Team)

FALLSAFE



FallSafe is an innovative digital solution that reimagines fall risk assessment for seniors. Developed by a team of forward-thinking students, the prototype transforms a traditionally manual, clinic-based process into an accessible, home-based tool to empower seniors to monitor their fall risk independently. Harnessing IoT, AI, and cloud-native technologies, FallSafe promotes preventive care and early intervention, while enhancing user engagement through gamification, teleconsultation, and multi-language support. Its inclusive design has earned praise

from community partners like Lions Befrienders, who recognize its potential for integration with existing elderly care platforms.

The team's technical excellence – demonstrated through AWS Cloud Certification and effective collaboration – has resulted in a solution aligned with Singapore's Smart Nation goals. By enabling data-driven insights and better resource allocation for healthcare providers, FallSafe supports a healthier, more connected ageing population. With future plans for mobile deployment and integration with apps like Healthy 365, FallSafe is poised to make a meaningful impact on eldercare nationwide. The project is currently being submitted to represent Ngee Ann Polytechnic at the Lee Hsien Loong Interactive Digital Media Smart Nation Award, a testament to its national relevance and innovation potential.

Outstanding Sports Award (Individual)

Quek Yong Izaac



Izaac is a distinguished table tennis athlete who proudly represented Singapore at the Paris 2024 Olympics, competing against the world's best. Although he did not reach the podium, his resilient performance - winning a set and pushing Darko Jorgic, a top-ranked Slovenian player, to the limit - showcased his skill and determination on the global stage. Endorsed by the Singapore Table Tennis Association, Izaac exemplifies outstanding sportsmanship and integrity. Notably, during the Singapore Smash 2024, he demonstrated honesty by calling a ball in despite being at a disadvantage, reflecting his unwavering commitment to fairness.

Beyond competitive play, Izaac actively engages with the community through meet-and-greet sessions and mentorship, inspiring young athletes to develop both their skills and character. His dedication to excellence, respect, and leadership makes him a true role model on and off the court.

Outstanding Sports Award (Team)

Swimming Men's & Women's Team



For the first time in Ngee Ann Polytechnic's history, the Men's and Women's Swimming Teams clinched the Overall Championship at the Inter-Varsity-Polytechnic Games (IVP), competing against 13 institutions. The Men's team secured a commendable 3rd place, while the Women's team dominated with a 1st place finish, propelling NP to the top overall position.

Driven by passion, dedication, and relentless hard work, the swimmers exemplify outstanding teamwork and mutual trust, continually motivating each other to push beyond their limits. The team is also notably inclusive, welcoming both competitive swimmers and those in the development squad. This inclusive approach has enabled many development swimmers to progress and win medals in major competitions like POL-ITE and IVP.

Issen is a dedicated community leader known for his empathy, inclusivity, and teamwork. At Ngee Ann Polytechnic, he serves as Community Service Assistant Director for Rotaract Club, leading initiatives supporting the elderly through partnerships with Care Corner Singapore, Kwong Wai Shiu Hospital, and Tzu Chi Foundation. Beyond campus, Issen is an Assistant Secretary and Grassroots Leader in Ang Mo Kio GRC's Jalan Kayu Youth Network, driving sustainability projects like Project: Kayu Wave and Marine100. He actively supports residents as a Case Writer at Meet-the-People Sessions and contributes to public sector efforts with NTUC, NECDC, and PAYM. Enterprise Award (Individual)

Mabel Chang Rong Min

Mabel founded Stonks+, an educational startup creating online learning packages that combine notes, mind maps, flashcards, and exam questions. Initially focused on STEM subjects, Mabel pivoted to humanities and languages to fill a gap in educational resources, demonstrating resilience and strategic thinking. Operating on a B2B pay-per-transaction model, Stonks+ earns around \$3,300 monthly and has helped over 15,000 students. The startup was also a Top 10 finalist in the 2024 National Youth Entrepreneurship Award.

Poly Stage Production

Poly Stage Production (PSP) is the technical backbone of Ngee Ann Polytechnic's performing arts, known for delivering top-tier stage production and problem-solving under pressure. They excelled with a complex three-way camera livestream for NP Hip Hop's Danzation, executing it flawlessly within a week. PSP supports major events like Arts Fiesta and faculty showcases, managing multiple productions seamlessly while maintaining high standards. Their collaborations with NP schools and external partners bridge student learning and professional practice, boosting NP's arts reputation. Through mentorship and technical workshops, PSP cultivates sustainable expertise. Their reliability, flexibility, and professionalism make them vital to NP's arts community.

Club, Society or Interest Group Award

Overflow

Overflow is an ICT interest group that regularly equips students with programming skills in Linux, Computer Vision, and AI. Despite being ICT-focused, it attracts members from BA and SOE schools. Annually, Overflow hosts flagship events like ByteHackz and the Polytechnic-ITE Olympiad in Informatics (PIOI), fostering competitive programming. The group has achieved top placements in national and regional competitions, including 1st and 2nd in the Senior Category at SUTD RoboRoarz 2024 and Quacker's Commendations at NUS Hack&Roll 2025. Overflow also gives back by collaborating with Leo Club and Potong Pasir CC to teach elderly digital skills, promoting interdisciplinary learning with partners like NP AiSIG and NUS Hackers.



Sports Award (Team)

Basketball Men's Team
