Entrepreneurial Students from Polytechnics to be identified for Discretionary Admission into NUS

Singapore, o8 February 2019 — Starting from 2019 university admissions exercise, the National University of Singapore (NUS) will work with all five polytechnics to identify graduating students who have exhibited entrepreneurial traits and provide a pathway for them to realise their entrepreneurial ambitions.

NUS and polys will work together to identify entrepreneurial poly students to be considered for admission into NUS.

These graduating students whom the polytechnics would nominate must also apply to NUS. If their academic results do not meet the NUS admissions requirements, they will be interviewed and considered for admissions to their first-choice courses¹ via the Discretionary Admissions Scheme.

Entrepreneurial Pathway Extends from Polytechnic Years to University Years

The grooming of young entrepreneurs has been a focus for polytechnics and NUS. Signature programmes include the NUS Overseas College Programme, Ngee Ann Polytechnic's Global Entrepreneurial Internship Programme, Temasek Polytechnic's Launchpad and Singapore Polytechnic's Entrepreneurship@SP. This collaboration between NUS and the five polytechnics paves the way for talented polytechnic students with an aptitude for entrepreneurship to continue to develop their skills, work on their start-ups and build relevant internship experiences from the

polytechnic years into the university years. For example, they can take part in long internship experiences, typically six months to a year in start-up ecosystems, once in the polytechnics and again in the University. By age 25, some of these students may have picked up two Asean languages on top of English and their mother tongue, and would have lived and worked in two other cities besides Singapore.

"We encourage polytechnic students to seize the initiative to take part in overseas internships, to work in and among start-ups, and find their life's purpose in disrupting the way we live and work," said Mr Clarence Ti, Principal of Ngee Ann Polytechnic.

Recognising Entrepreneurial Talents

This entrepreneurial pathway provides an additional avenue for talented polytechnic graduates who have displayed strong entrepreneurial abilities to be considered for admission into NUS.

Students nominated by the polytechnics will need to demonstrate that they have diligently applied themselves to gain and develop entrepreneurial skills and relevant work experiences working in the innovation ecosystems either locally or abroad. Hence, students who have worked hard in building a compelling portfolio that showcases their entrepreneurial skills and experiences would have an added advantage.

The Polytechnics are expected to nominate up to 200 students to be considered for admission under this collaboration.

Nominated polytechnic students will be interviewed by the faculties and schools that offer their firstchoice non-interview courses.
